#### **Debate Resolution:**

"This House Believes That Churchill would have supported whistleblowers exposing misconduct in government agencies and committees to the public."

- Parliamentary style, including Points of Information in constructive speeches
- Senior High National Style: 8 minutes Government One, 8 minutes Opposition One, 8 minutes Government Two, 8 minutes Opposition Two, 4 minutes Opposition One (rebuttal), 4 minutes Government One (rebuttal)
- Competitors will be judged based on their ability to present logical arguments in an organized fashion, without using artificial emotional tactics to win over their audiences. Passion without reason will be strictly penalized.
- Debaters are expected to take into account Churchill's demonstrated beliefs, while considering the advantages and disadvantages of the whistleblowers. They are encouraged to examine the issues in a modern and historical context.

#### **Speech Topic:**

Express your views on whistleblowers exposing misconduct in government agencies and committees to the public.

- Maximum speaking time: 5 minutes
- Competitors will be judged based on their ability to present logical arguments in an organized fashion, without using artificial emotional tactics to win over their audiences. Passion without reason will be strictly penalized.

There will be three rounds of debate and speech run congruently and then a break for lunch. After lunch we will hold the semi-final debate round and speech round. The semi-finalist teams (top 4) will be chosen first based on win-loss record, and second on speaker points. Advancement into the semi-final round in speech will be based on speaker scores, with approximately six students advancing according to a clean division in scores. After that round will be the announcement of the teams and speakers advancing to the finals at McKay Avenue School to be held at a later date in the fall.

The semi-finalist debate teams and the top three public speakers, as well as one coach from each school receiving an award, will receive complimentary tickets to the Churchill Society banquet in Spring 2013, where students will be presented with medals, a book prize, and a cash award.
